The five candidates from the Elevate group were repeatedly seen approaching students—sometimes individually, sometimes as a group—relentlessly urging them to vote. Beyond just encouragement, I noticed them lingering near voters while casting their ballots, closely watching and pressuring students to support them. This conduct directly violates the election code, which strictly forbids candidates from observing voters during the voting process. The election commissioner made this clear during candidate orientation, stressing that once a voter is on the voting page, you must step back. Multiple students, including several who spoke to me personally, reported feeling forced or coerced into voting for these candidates. Classmates have echoed similar concerns about the Elevate group's intimidating tactics. To add on, these candidates blatantly disregarded other election rules. The commissioner explicitly prohibited the use of classroom resources for campaigning, including office supplies like the

whiteboard and dry-erase markers. Yet, I found a classroom with their names and ballot numbers on the board. Videos show a student stating that the Elevate candidates forced him to vote for their entire slate. The footage reveals non-candidates—who had been campaigning for the group over the two-week period—standing over a student as he voted, using hand gestures like scrolling to direct him to their names on the election page. These non-candidates had been at the Elevate table, actively campaigning for them during the first two weeks. With all that said, I'm not intentionally trying to find ways to send in a complaint; the evidence came to me first, and all I wanted was an equal campaigning experience.
